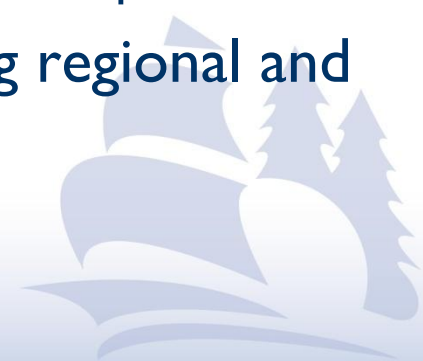

- Community Social Data Strategy (CSDS) is the flagship initiative of the Canadian Council on Social Development.
- Building a national network of social data users to understand local social & economic trends.
- The 3 core purposes of the CSDS are to:
  1. Purchase and facilitate access to social data
  2. Provide support for social data processing and analysis
  3. Communicate & disseminate results as widely as possible.
- Benefits:
  1. Cost effective for member organizations
  2. Provides a forum for agencies to discuss local community trends, challenges, and research.
  3. Fosters sector-to-sector connections nationally.



- CSDS membership is available through CYFS Coalition.
- 53 trained staff from 17 local agencies (*Sept 2010*).
- Local projects using census data include:
  - Full Day Early Learning planning
  - Community Profiles
  - EDI community profiles
  - Social housing needs assessment
  - Data requests related to community trends, such as poverty, immigration, Francophone, Aboriginal, population growth patterns.
- Census data is a valuable tool for understanding regional and local trends in the community.



# 2011 is a Census year!

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- Nationally, the CSDS has a new and enhanced website:
  - Easier to use data catalogue
  - Social Networking tools to enhance communication between members
  - Library of resources and research
  - GeoClip, a GIS resource
- Planning for the 2011 census data purchase has begun.
  - CSDS Needs Assessment Survey (online)
  - Review of relevance of data included in the data package
  - Alternative sources of local data?

**How will the National Household Survey affect local level data?**

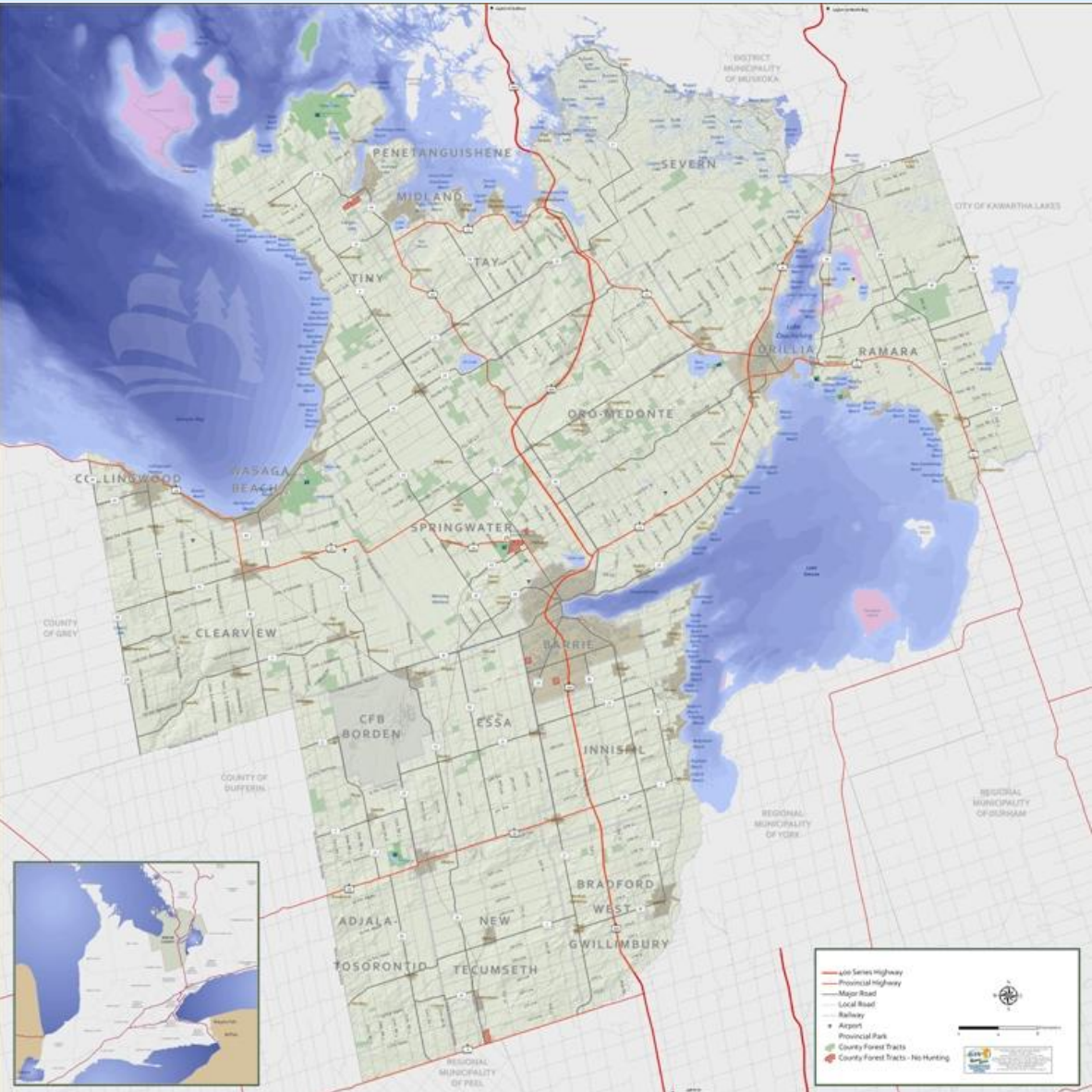


- Replacing the **mandatory** census long-form questionnaire, which was received by 20% of the population.
- Will be a **voluntary** survey sent to 30% of the population
- Impacts include *lower quality* and *less availability* of data:
  - Lower response rate
  - Under representativeness from vulnerable population groups
  - Over representativeness from higher income and education
  - Smaller areas of geography will be particularly affected
  - Fewer methods of statistical analysis will be available
- Discussions at the national and local level about implications of the NHS.



- The following tables include the census division of Simcoe County, which includes 20 census subdivisions:
  - 16 municipalities
  - 2 cities of Barrie and Orillia
  - 2 First Nations Reserves, when data is available
- To maintain confidentiality data is randomly rounded up or down to '5' or '10', so no individual can be identified.
- If the population in the geographic area is less than 40, the data is suppressed (deleted) altogether.
- Areas identified in **red** have a value higher than the Simcoe County average value, for individual census variables.
- Unless noted, census data presented is from 2006.

# Simcoe County, geographically



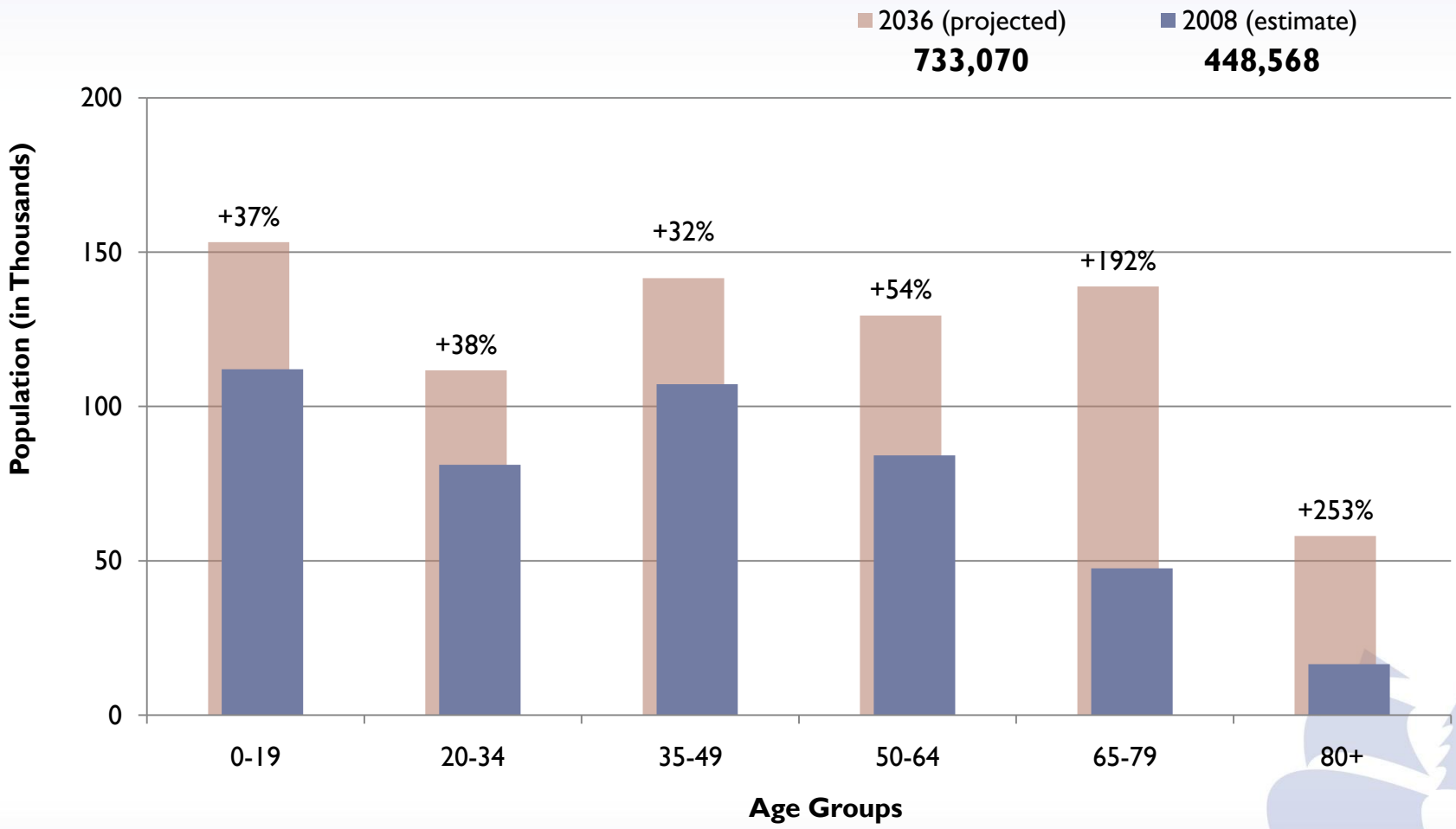

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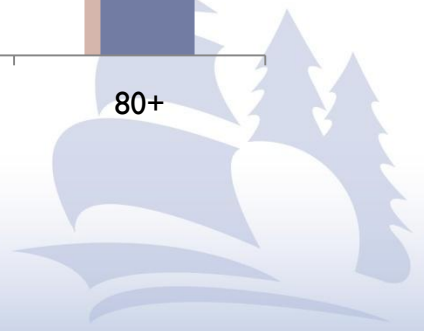
# What is Simcoe County like, DEMOGRAPHICALLY?



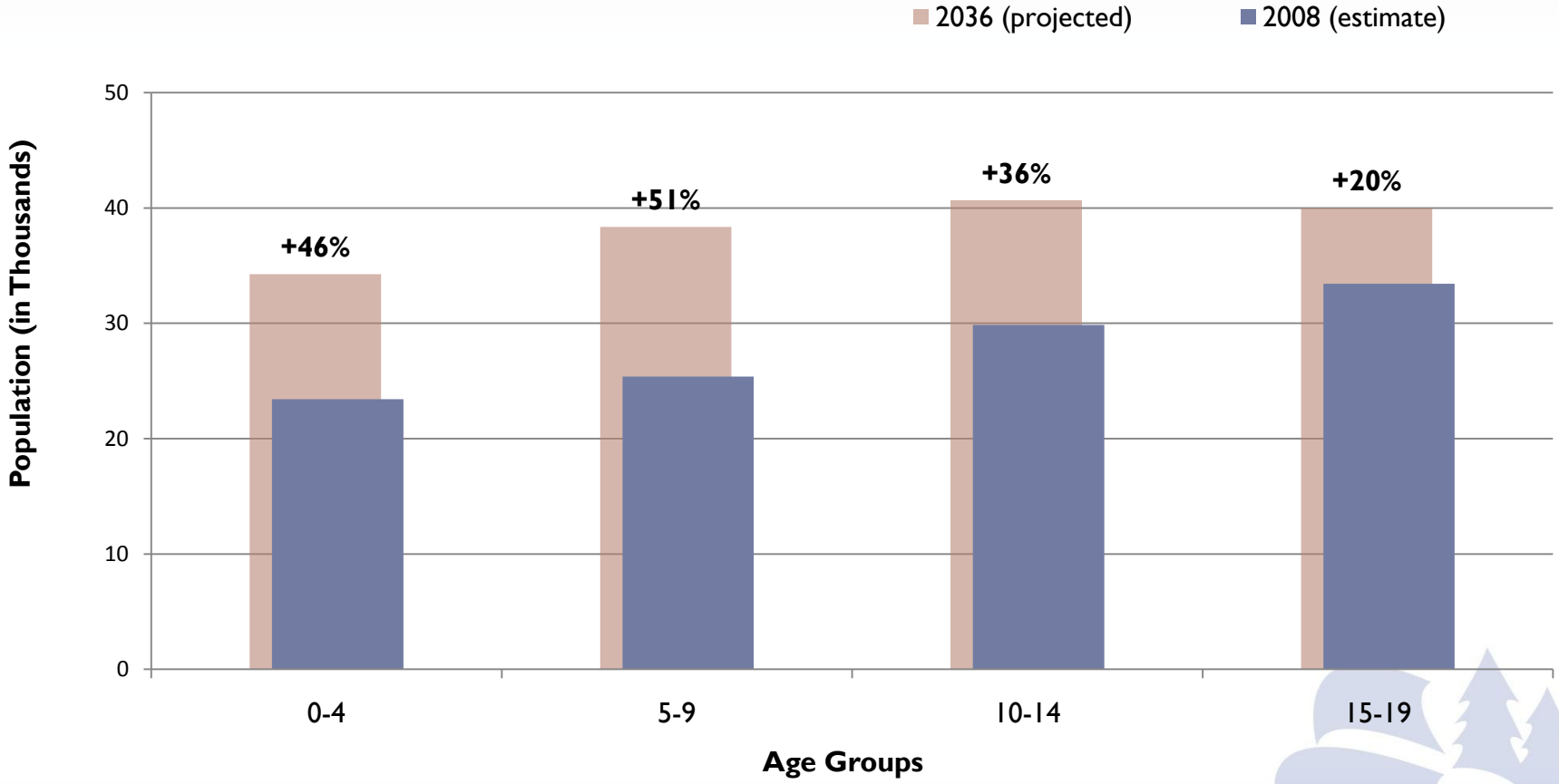

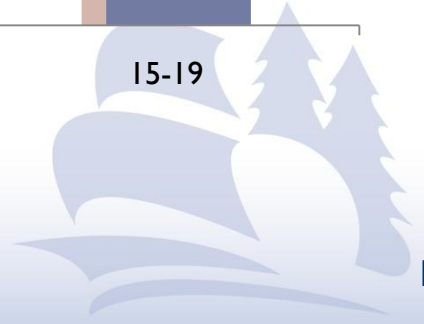

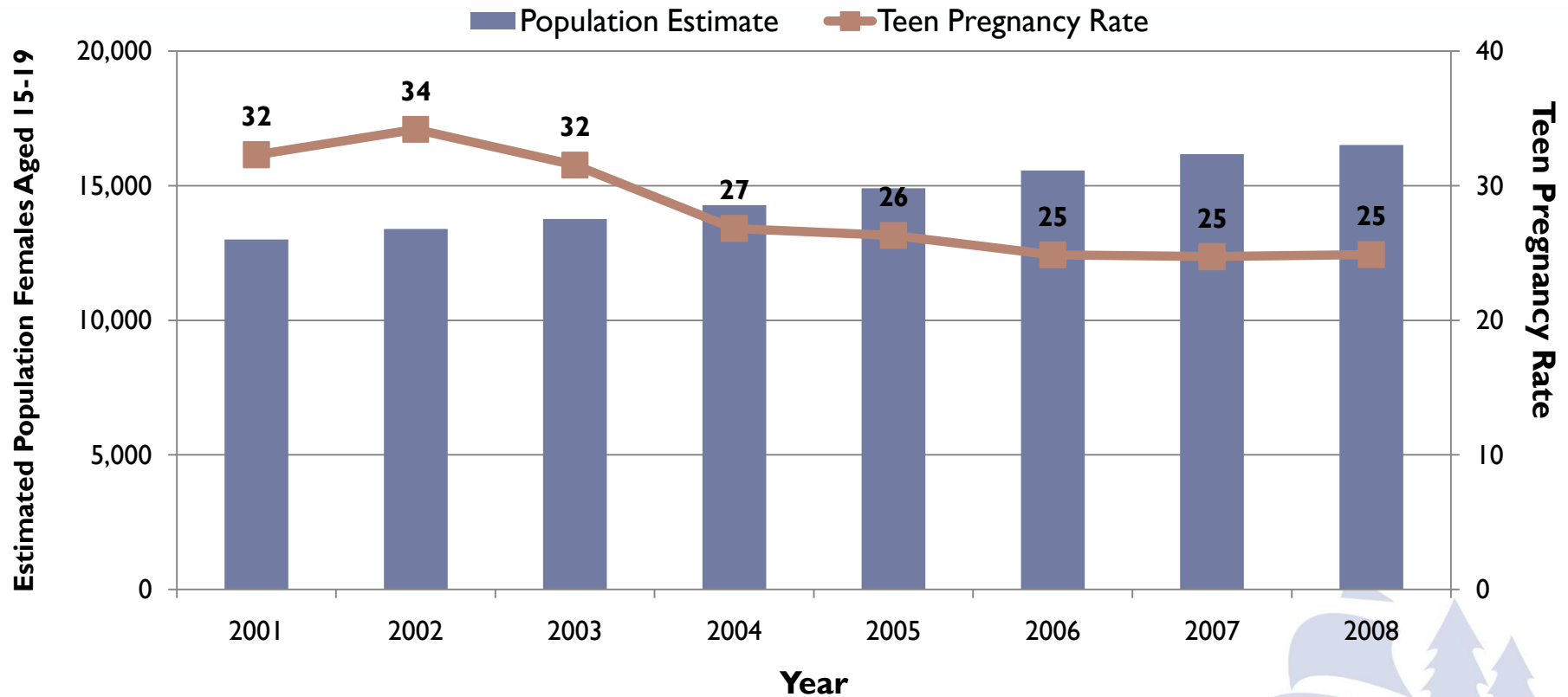

# Teenage Pregnancy Rate



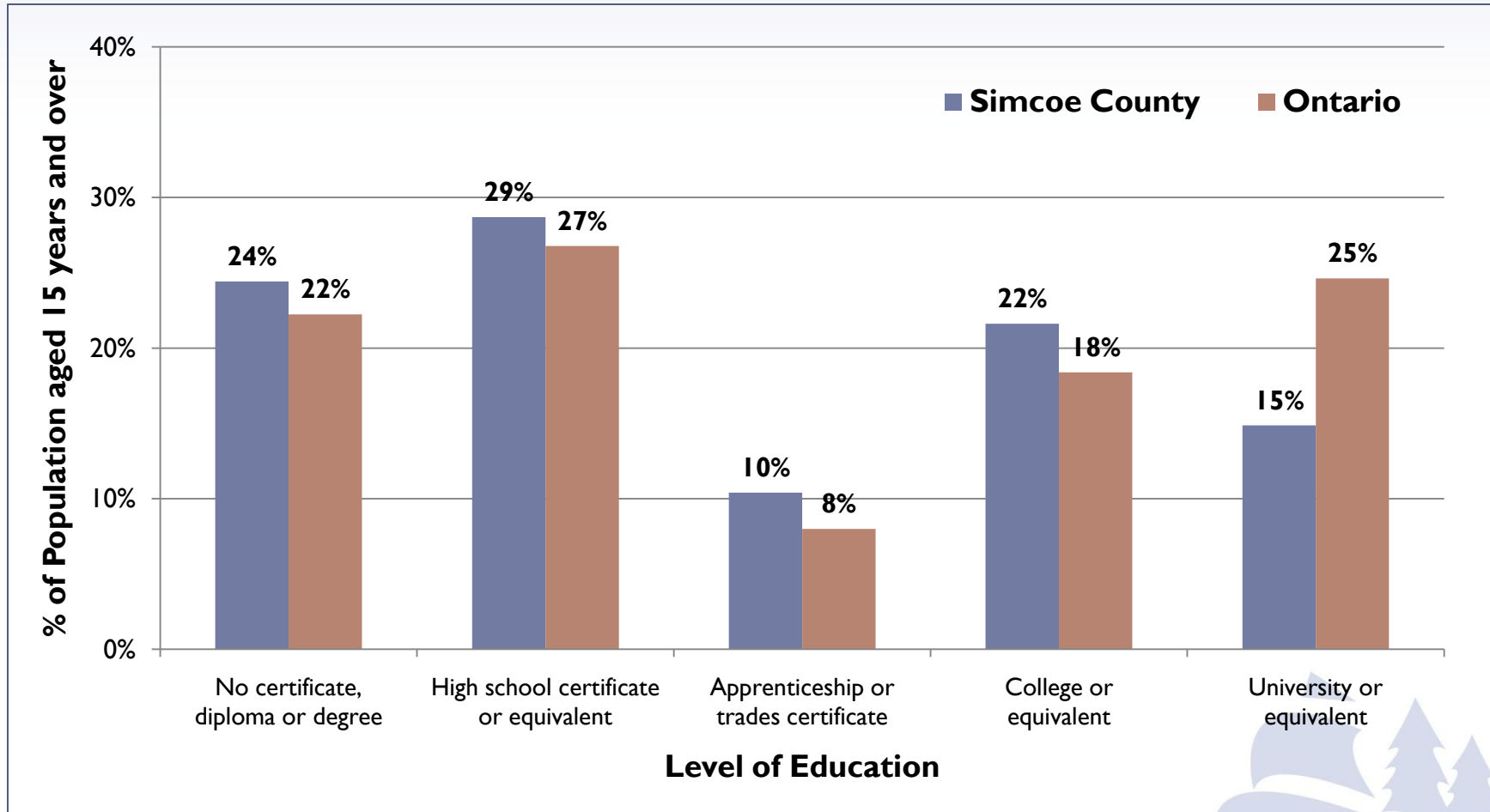
## Number of pregnancies per 1000 females aged 15-19

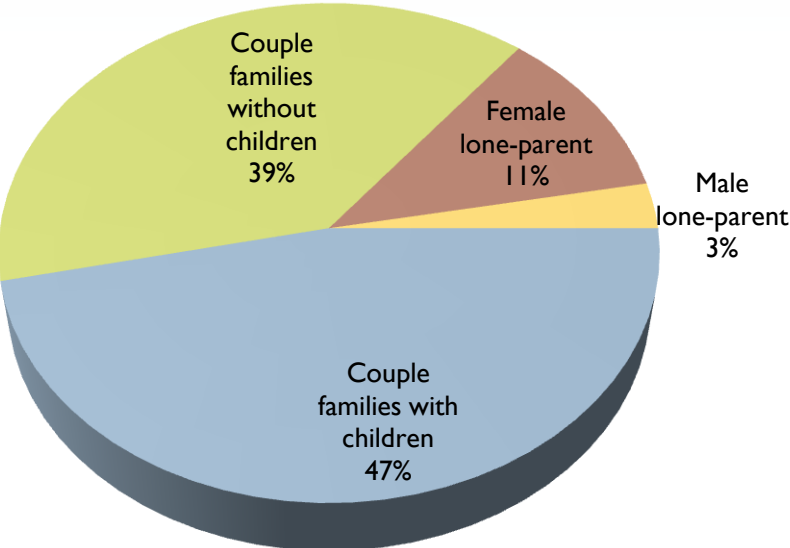

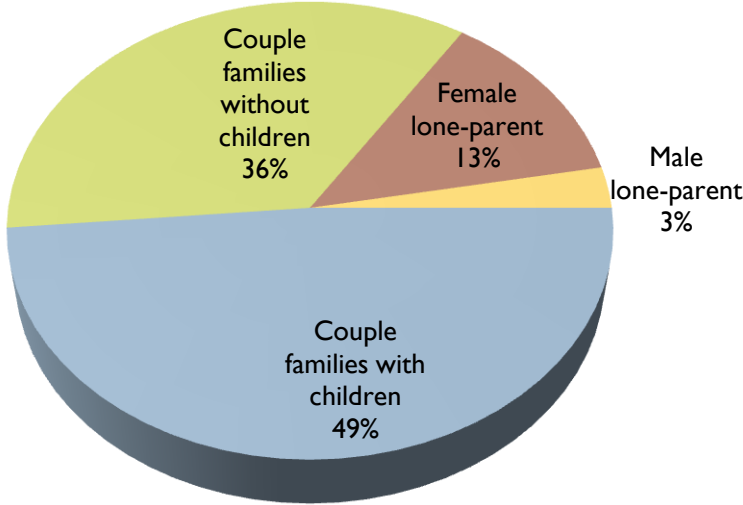
# Family Structure

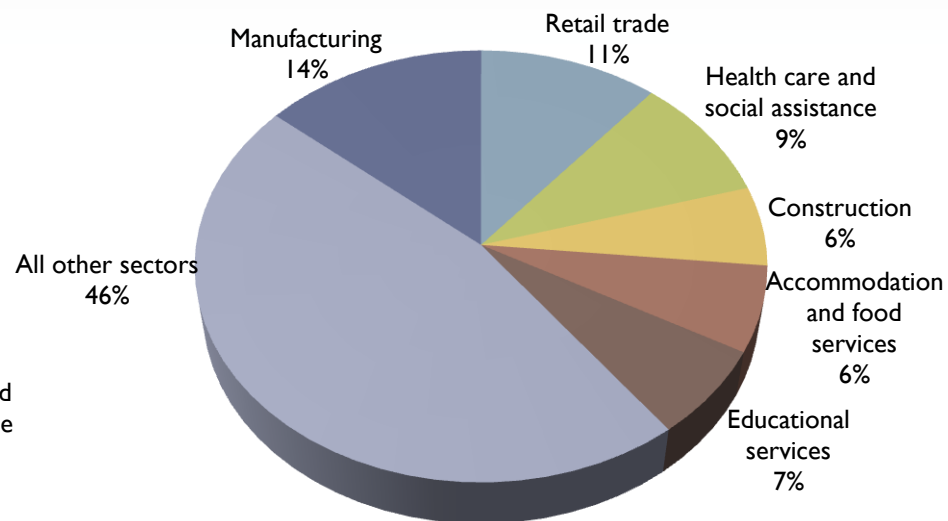

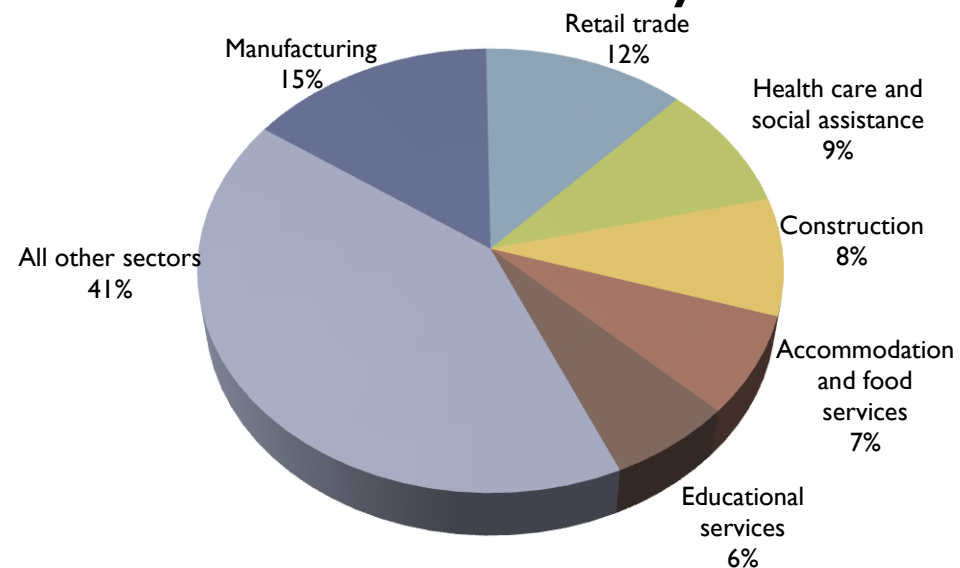

**BUT:** almost **10,000 families** in Simcoe County are living in low income.

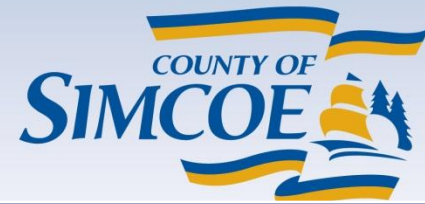

\*It should be noted that not all households spending 30% or more of incomes on shelter costs are necessarily experiencing housing affordability problems. This is particularly true of households with high incomes. There are also other households who choose to spend more on shelter than on other goods. Nevertheless, the allocation of 30% or more of a household's income to housing expenses provides a useful benchmark for assessing trends in housing affordability.

The **Town of Penetanguishene** and the **Townships of Tiny and Essa** are designated under the *French Language Services Act*, which guarantees the right to services in French from provincial government offices in the area. For an area to obtain designation, Francophones must make up at least 10% of its population.

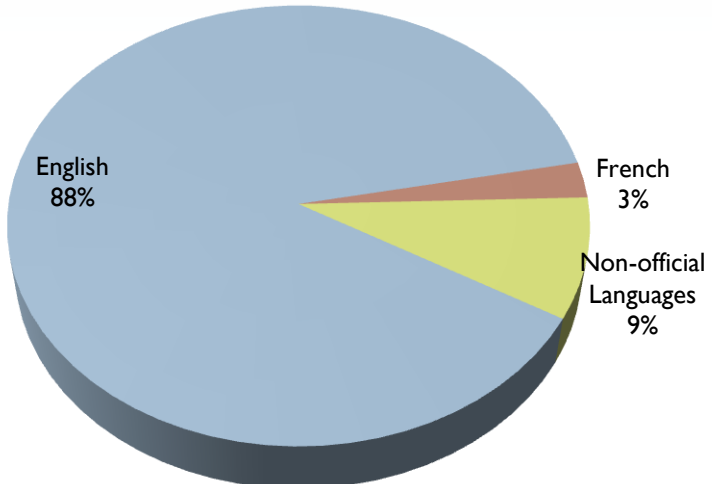
